


Figure 10.17.

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Problem 10.4. ²⁴ There are 9 snakes coiled in closed loops under the carpet: 3 black, 3 striped, and 3 white (see Figure 10.17).

Problem 1. These two snakes sleep holding their tails in their mouths. Is it possible to detangle them without waking them up, so that they would keep holding their tails in their mouths?
